Key Selection Criteria

Mandatory

- 1. A degree in law, and eligible for admission to practice
- 2. Demonstrated criminal law casework and advocacy experience
- 3. Demonstrated experience working with youth clients or similar client group experiencing or who have experienced disadvantage, trauma or other vulnerabilities
- 4. Strong commitment to social justice, including a demonstrated understanding of the social context of law and the issues faced by vulnerable communities and the ability to contribute to WEstjustice's systemic impact work
- 5. Demonstrated ability to work effectively with a range of internal and external stakeholders
- 6. Ability to work under the direction of senior employees, including highly developed organisational and administration skills
- 7. Ability to supervise the work of volunteers and students
- 8. Ability to develop and deliver community legal education work under direction.
- 9. Excellent written and oral communication skills
- 10. Ability to travel to outreach clinics across the West, regularly attend youth office in Sunshine and other WEstjustice offices as required, and attend courts in CBD and regional areas.
- 11. Understanding of and commitment to WEstjustice's Vision, Purpose, Strategic Plan and Impact Areas.
